#### Blwyddyn 1 & 2-Reflection Areas

In Year 1 and 2, pupils have discussed our values of respect, friendship and care and have written prayers for our class reflection area.



#### Blwyddyn 5 & 6 - Positive Cultures

Pupils in Dosbarth Penfro have been learning about unacceptable behaviours this week and when these behaviours are classed as bullying. They have looked at a range of scenarios and discussed whether or not they are bullying using scenario based activities.

Following this, pupils then worked to understand the impact that these behaviours have on the victim and their peers or family and the actions that they should take. Pupils also discussed the importance of being an 'upstander' and not a 'bystander', and how to navigate and work through situations which may cause them concern. Pupils engaged maturely in discussions and responded well to the scenarios that were discussed. Well done indeed Year 5 & 6!















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#### Blwyddyn 3 & 4- Reflecting on our school ethos

This week we have spent time focusing on our school ethos. We reflected on what Respect, Friendship and Care looks like. We also focused on what bullying is and what we can do if someone is being bullied. We completed a Kahoot quiz and then looked at a range of scenarios to see if we could tell if it was rude, mean or bullying. We all understood the important message and can continue to be good role models!



#### Reception- Friendship and Christian Values

We have listened to lots of stories about friendship and discussed what makes a good friend. In small groups we made some delicious 'friendship soup'. In our RVE sessions we have been talking about Christian symbols. We visited Church to find different symbols and important items.















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#### Blwyddyn 1 & 2- Children In Need & Expressive Arts

At the end of last week, we celebrated Children In Need day by wearing non-uniform and Pudsey ears. We also learnt about famous Artist Vincent Van Gogh's artwork entitled 'Starry Night' and had a go at recreating it ourselves.

Pupils have looked at what makes a good friend. They have been talking about what qualities are important to them and linked this to our core school values, respect, friendship and care. The pupils then wrote their own friendship recipe and discussed how to show respect, friendship and care.


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#### Blwyddyn 1 & 2- Being Safe Online
